About City:

Valencia is the 3rd largest city in Spain and has all the cultural, educational and gastronomic benefits of a large city but still is a city of Barrios. Each like its own small Pueblo or village with a friendly easy going cafe lifestyle. It is a city where you are more likely to wake up to church bells and birds singing than traffic and urban noise. Valencia unlike its larger siblings Madrid and Barcelona still maintains an authentic Spanish lifestyle while it has grown into a vibrant modern city. There are numerous play areas, the fantastic Bio Park Zoo and Oceanographic Aquarium are sites to see again and again. There are easy connections to most European capitals and even a direct flight to the United States. High speed rail reached Valencia in 2010 and Madrid is now only an hour and a half away by train. The mountains are 15 minutes by car and beaches abound, from the expansive, well groomed Las Arenas and Malvarosa beaches in the city to the peaceful naturalism of the nearby undeveloped shore. At Perfect Spain we are of course biased as we come from Europe, the Americas, Asia and Australia, and all chose to live here. Come visit and see for yourself. All in all Valencia is a Perfect Place to be.

Climate

Valencia has a subtropical Mediterranean climate with short, very mild winters and long, hot and dry summers. Its average annual temperature is 18.4 °C (65.1 °F); 23.0 °C (73.4 °F) during the day and 13.8 °C (56.8 °F) at night. Spring, from March to May, is mild and sunny, with rainy days still possible, but not very frequent, and some afternoon thunderstorms that stray from the interior in late spring. In May, and sometimes in April, the first hot days occur, with highs around 30 °C (86 °F). The amount of sunshine in Valencia is very good in summer, when clear skies prevail, it is good in spring and autumn, and decent even in winter: there are on average 5 hours of sunshine per day in December, 5 and a half in January and 6 in February.

Tourism

Spain's third-largest city is a magnificent place, content for Madrid and Barcelona to grab the headlines while it gets on with being a wonderfully liveable city with thriving cultural, eating and nightlife scenes. Never afraid to innovate, Valencia diverted its flood-prone river to the outskirts and converted the former riverbed into a glorious green ribbon of park winding right through the city. On it are the strikingly futuristic buildings of the Ciudad de las Artes y las Ciencias, designed by local boy Santiago Calatrava. Other brilliant contemporary buildings grace the city, which also has a fistful of fabulous Modernista buildings, great museums, a long stretch of beach and a large, characterful old quarter. Valencia, surrounded by its huerta, a fertile zone of market gardens, is famous as the home of rice dishes such as paella, but its buzzy dining scene offers plenty more besides; it's a superb spot for eating.

Transportation

Public transport is provided by the Ferrocarrils de la Generalitat Valenciana (FGV), which operates the Metrovalencia and other rail and bus services. The Estació del Nord (North Station) is the main railway terminus in Valencia. A new temporary station, Estació de València-Joaquín Sorolla, has been built on land adjacent to this terminus to accommodate high speed AVE trains to and from Madrid, Barcelona, Seville and Alicante. Valencia Airport is situated 9 km (5.6 mi) west of Valencia city centre. Alicante Airport is situated about 133 km (83 mi) south of center of Valencia. The City of Valencia also makes available a bicycle sharing system named Valenbisi to both visitors and residents.
